NOVEMBER GENERAL MEETING



Michael Jacobs introduced guest speaker Dean Hollin. Dean discovered his love for the stage whilst in high school – and promptly decided then and there that becoming an entertainer was what he simply must do. His love for the Great American

Songbook – beginning with music of Cole Porter – began when Dean was in his mid-twenties. Acting on stage, or for the camera – musical theatre – singing – emceeing – writing, directing – radio – are all aspects of his professional life.

"Scooped up" by Moses Znaimer two years ago – he is the host of "Radio Limelite – All Things Great American Songbook" and "Big Band Sunday Night" as well as the co-host of "The Garden Show" – all on AM 740.

On The New Classical FM, he hosts Saturday and Sunday mornings' "Breakfast Classics".

His website – very simply – deanhollin.com com.

Dean is a very enthusiastic speaker with a vast knowledge of American Music from the 1920's to the 1950's, and on. He is specifically fond of those composers that wrote for stage productions of operettas and classical plays. He explained that most composers of the time used the traditional 3/4 music signature familiar to most as waltz time. Music was a way for the black slaves to pass time while working and especially while resting after a hard day's work. They had a certain type of rhythm and beat to their music that caught on with the plantations' owners as a form of entertainment for their like-minded guests. Those tunes had some of their own moves/dances that enhanced the music such as "The Cake Walk" which got its name from the servants impersonating themselves serving the masters. Eventually the music and dance was adopted by the plantation owners and soon there were white people impersonating the blacks (Al Jolson). Of course, this led to minstrel shows and then Vaudeville shows that travelled from town to town.

There are 55 recognized writers in the Great American Song Book and slowly the composers wrote music and lyrics more to enhance and continue the story of the play or musical and less as an aside. He mentioned such stage plays as Music Man and Show Boat to emphasize this fact. Dean emphasized certain composers such as Hammerstein, Rogers, Howard Arlen and of course his favourite. Cole Porter.

He also stated that some of the best composers are unknown in their home towns and to the public although they may have written many successful songs.

Dean showed his singing voice in emphasizing certain songs by some of the composers that may be unfamiliar to us with the original titles.

He provided the group an insight into what was a very rich musical time in the U.S. and the world. Gene Stephenson


